SEPTEMBER 7th PAWTUCKET (61-81) at SYRACUSE (75-68) 2:00 pm

Pawtucket Red Sox RHP Enrique Gonzalez (8-11, 5.24) vs. Syracuse Chiefs RHP Shairon Martis (4-4, 5.00)

Wait 'til Next Year - The Pawtucket Red Sox conclude the 2009 season this afternoon against the Syracuse Chiefs at 2:00 pm at Alliance Bank Stadium. The PawSox will look to end the season with a 4-game winning streak after beating the Chiefs 8-2 on Saturday night at McCoy Stadium, before sweeping a doubleheader last night in Syracuse 12-5 and 10-2.

See You in 212 Days – All eyes are focused on a clean slate to start the 2010 which will begin at McCoy Stadium in about seven and a half months (212 days to be exact) when the PawSox play their 2010 home-opener on Thursday night, April 8 vs. the Rochester Red Wings. The tentative 2010 IL Schedule has the PawSox beginning the season with a 6-game homestand from April 8-13 with four games against Rochester (April 8 & 9 at night and then over the weekend of April 10 & 11 in the afternoon) followed by two games vs. the Lehigh Valley IronPigs on April 12 & 13. (The PawSox played one of their latest home-openers in many years this season when they hosted Leigh Valley on April 17). Pawtucket's first roadtrip next year will be a 9-game, 3-city trip to Buffalo, Rochester, and Lehigh Valley from April 14-22. The PawSox will then return to McCoy to finish off the month of April with an 8-game homestand from April 23-30 (four vs. Buffalo and four vs. Indianapolis). The Sox are slated to end the regular-season next year again on Labor Day (September 6th) and again vs. Syracuse - but this time at McCoy Stadium.

Thank You PawSox Fans - The PawSox – who prior to this year had finished 1st in the International League in attendance three times (2004, '05, '08) in the past five years (and second the other two years) – will finish 3rd in the league in attendance this year behind Columbus (which opened their sparkling new stadium this season) and Lehigh Valley. Pawtucket is currently 3rd in attendance as they have broken the 600,000 mark for the 8th season and the 6th in a row. The Sox finished at 625,561 fans in 70 openings. An amazing total of 6,848,411 fans have enjoyed the New McCoy Stadium since the renovated and expanded ballpark opened in 1999.

Hurts So Bad – The 81 losses thus far are the most the PawSox have had in a season since the 84 losses in 2002 when they went 60-84 and finished -31 GB (their current deficit of -21 GB and wherever they finish this year will be their largest since that 2002 season). Pawtucket also had 84 defeats in both 1989 & 1990 but next on the list is the club-record 91 losses suffered all the way back in 1985.

Won't be Last – Pawtucket will not finish in the IL North basement as they are guaranteed a 5th-place finish. The PawSox have not finished in last-place since the expanded IL East/North was formed in 1991, but Pawtucket did finish in 4th-place (which was last-place) in both 1989 & 1990 in the four-team IL East that consisted of just Rochester, Scranton/WB, Syracuse, and Pawtucket.

Hometown Blues – Pawtucket did win 4 of their final 6 home games to finish with a 32-39 mark at McCoy. The PawSox had a rough go of it at home over the last two months as they came up losers during four of their last six homestands since July 9. The Sox just finished 2-2 on their final homestand after recently going 4-7 on their longest homestand in more than 10 years as the stand ran from August 18-27. Since July 9 the Sox have gone 0-4, 1-3, 2-2, 2-4, 4-7, and 2-2 during their last 6 homestands. Prior to that they had won two, split three, and lost only one of their first 6 homestands. Pawtucket's only winning homestands this season came during their first two of the year as they went 3-2 (mid-April) and 6-2 (early-May). They went 4-4 in late-May, 3-4 in early-June, 2-2 in mid-June, and 3-3 in late-June/early-July. Since then it's been pretty much downhill here at McCoy as the Sox have lost 23 of their last 34 home games since July 3.

September Mourn – The PawSox are 4-3 in September. Pawtucket played just one September regular-season game last year and it came on Sept. 1 vs. Lehigh Valley (a 9-2 Sox win at McCoy Stadium). Pawtucket then moved to the IL Playoffs where they lost to Scranton/WB, 3 games to 1 (Sept. 3-7). For the fifth time in the last six years there will be no playoffs for the PawSox this September as Pawtucket was officially eliminated from playoff contention on August 22.

August Moon – The PawSox finished August at 9-23 (.281) for their third-worst month in club-history as they narrowly avoided matching their club-mark for most losses in a single month (24 set in June of 1975). The PawSox were coming off their second-worst month in team-history (winning pct.-wise) this past July when they went 7-19 (.269). Their worst month on record is May of 1985 when they went 7-20 (.259). This August the Sox had a .225 average (232-for-1030) and a 4.29 ERA (132 ER in 277 IP). The Sox played 32 games in 31 days in August and they were out-scored 141-92 last month.

At The 'Cuse – The Sox are 7-8 overall vs. the Chiefs thus far (3-5 at McCoy and 4-3 in Syracuse). The rivals met in Syracuse on April 28 (postponed due to rain) and April 29 (a 4-1 Syracuse win). Then, in mid-June, the teams faced each other again. The June 11 game was rained-out and will be made-up as part of a doubleheader today. On June 12 the Chiefs swept a make-up doubleheader from the PawSox by identical 4-1 scores. The Sox earned their first win in the season-series with a 6-2 victory on June 13 and gained a split of that 4-game series with a 15-5 rout of the Chiefs on June 14 in the Cooperstown Classic played at Doubleday Field in Cooperstown, NY (the 15 runs still a PawSox season-high).

Ten Pinned – On August 21 the PawSox put a halt to their season-high 10-game losing streak (which began on August 12 and ran through August 20). It was their longest in nearly 16 years - since they lost 10 straight to end the 1993 season. The only other longer losing streak in club-history is a franchise-record 13-game losing streak in 1985. Pawtucket has also endured an 8-game skid last month (from July 8-18). Pawtucket's season-high 7-game winning streak occurred from May 2-8.

A Difficult Stretch – In addition to dropping 19 of their last 28 games, over a longer stretch the Sox have lost 26 of 39, 30 of 44, 40 of 57, and 45 of their last 64 games since July 3. Since early-July, the Sox have suffered a trio of 3-game losing streaks, a pair of 4-game losing skids, an 8-game losing streak (July 8-18), and a season-high 10-game skid (August 12-20).

A Consistent Slump – During this current tough stretch the Sox have dropped 23 of their last 34 at home (since July 3) and 23 of their last 31 on the road (since June 26).

What a Difference a Year Makes – Pawtucket is 61-81 on the season. Last year they finished 85-58 as the 85 wins were a franchise-record. After 142 games last year the PawSox had an 84-58 record. They are 23-games worse at this point this season.

Offensive Struggles – Pawtucket's team batting average is .234. The franchise-record for lowest batting average in a season is .237 in 1975. The Sox did smack a season-high 4 HR in an 8-5, 12-inning loss to Lehigh Valley on August 25 after having hit just 5 homers in their previous 14 games from August 12-24. They then did not homer in 7 straight games until Chris Carter cracked a 3-run blast in Wednesday's win over Rochester. Pawtucket had not had more than 2 HR in a game this season until the 4 HR game on Aug. 25 (they only time they have had 3 or more HR in a game all season). Last year they had 21 games with 3 HR or more in a game.

Finally A Theft – The PawSox had not stolen a base in 18 games from August 5-24 until Bubba Bell stole 2nd-base on August 25. The Sox have been caught stealing 6 times in 9 attempts since August 5 as Bell swiped another base on Aug. 27 and Danielson stole a base on Sept. 5.

Free-Falling - After a victory to begin July on July 2 the Sox were in 2nd-place and just -2½ GB. They finished the month in 5th-place, -9 GB. They are currently in 5th-place and a season-high of -21 GB.

Over and Done in July – The PawSox closed out what turned out to be their second worst month in club-history this July by finishing 7-19. Their victory in the July finale on July 31 in Buffalo enabled them to edge out their worst month on record which was May of 1985 when they went 7-20. Pawtucket's club-record for most games lost in a month is 24 in June of 1975. What made this past July even more shocking was the fact that it marked the first time the Sox had suffered a losing month of any sorts since August of 2007. Until this July, Pawtucket had been on a franchise-record of eight consecutive winning (full) months dating back to April of the 2008 season. Sox batters hit just .219 (184-for-840) with only 15 HR and 81 runs scored this past July (3.1 runs per game) while pitchers were 7-19 with a 4.91 ERA (123 ER in 225.2 IP). The Sox were out-scored 131-81 this July.

Daylight Savings – Despite dropping their last 5 afternoon games, the PawSox have had success in the day thus far going 22-15 in daylight affairs (20-14 in afternoon affairs and 2-1 in morning starts). The Sox are 39-66 in night games this season, however.

Blankety Blank – Pawtucket leads the league by being blanked 18 times this season (including 13 shutout losses since June 2) as they are 10-18 in shutout games on the year. Pawtucket was 9-5 in shutout games after a 2-0 win in Louisville on May 27. Since that point, however, the Sox have just one shutout to their credit (a 4-0 win at Charlotte on August 11). They have been shutout themselves 13 times during that stretch however. Pawtucket's franchise-record for most times shutout in a season is 21 during the 1989 season.

One For All – Pawtucket now has the second-best record in the league in 1-run games at 28-22 (Gwinnett is first at 27-18). The PawSox have tied their all-time franchise record for 1-run victories in a season with 28 – also set in both 1981 & 1992 as well.

Items of Interest – The PawSox were officially eliminated from any playoff contention on August 22 (with 17 games remaining) marking the earliest they have been eliminated from post-season consideration during a year since the 2002 season. From July 16 – August 8 the PawSox played 25 games in 24 consecutive days until their last scheduled off-day of the season which came on August 9. They are now playing their final 30 games in 29 straight days (August 10 – September 7) with no more off-days remaining. The PawSox have been held to 3 or fewer hits in a game 20 times this season. Pawtucket has 27 come-from-behind wins on the season. The Sox have 13 wins during their last at-bat of the game (including 7 walk-off wins). The PawSox are 35-29 when they homer in a game. The PawSox are 41-25 when they score first and 48-3 when they lead after 6-innings (their only losses in that category coming on May 30 in Indianapolis in 13-innings, 4-3; July 27 at home vs. Columbus, 4-3; and August 6 vs. Norfolk, 5-3). The Sox are 7-10 in extra-inning affairs.

A Season For the History Books – The 2008 wild card-winning Pawtucket Red Sox – who finished 85-58 last season (-2½ GB of eventual Governors’ Cup Champ Scranton/WB but 10½-games ahead in the wild card race) - set a new franchise-record for victories in a season with their 85 wins and they also established their highest winning pct. in a season at .594. The PawSox finished the regular-season at 85-58 to reach a franchise-record of 27-games over .500 (the third time they did that in 2008).

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today. Pawtucket is at the roster limit with 24 active players not including rehabbing RHP Daisuke Matsuzaka and rehabbing INF Jed Lowrie. The PawSox have used 60 different players this season (35 position players & 25 pitchers) – a healthy number but short of the franchise-record 70 players used in 2007.

INF Gil Velazquez (April 13), reliever Hunter Jones (April 15), 1B/OF Jeff Bailey (April 22 – and again on June 30), RHP Michael Bowden (April 26, August 21, and September 5), RHP Daniel Bard (May 10), catcher Dusty Brown (June 21), 1B Aaron Bates (July 6), RHP Clay Buchholz (July 17 and again on July 21), INF Jed Lowrie (July 18), RHP Marcus McBeth (July 31 & August 29), LHP Billy Traber (August 5), RHP Junichi Tazawa (August 7), RHP Enrique Gonzalez (August 8 & August 22), RHP Fernando Cabrera (August 9), OF Brian Anderson (August 15 & September 1), RHP Paul Byrd (August 30), OF Joey Gathright (September 1), INF Chris Woodward (September 1), and OF Josh Reddick (September 2) have been the first 18 promoted to Boston from Pawtucket this season. And that does not include 9 other rehabbing players who were recalled to Boston after their rehab stints with the PawSox - OF Jonathan Van Every (April 24), INF Julio Lugo (April 27), OF Rocco Baldelli (May 7 & August 21), INF Kevin Youkilis (May 20), RHP Daisuke Matsuzaka (May 22), OF Mark Kotsay (June 2), RHP John Smoltz (June 20), RHP Tim Wakefield (August 26), and C George Kottaras (September 1). Last year a total of 18 PawSox players also earned the call to Boston (not including rehabbers).
